Additional PhD Defence slots June 2023

Due to the very high demand for PhD defences in June 2023, additional timeslots will be made available. These slots will be opened on January 2, at the same time as the opening of the July slots.

Message from the AFSG Managing Board – Agreement with PhD candidate without employment

As of **1 January 2023**, it will be mandatory to sign an agreement with a PhD candidate without an employment contract and upload it in Hora Finita to ensure acceptance of e.g. obligations in the context of the WU PhD program, the Netherlands Code of Conduct for Research Integrity and to arrange (other) legal issues. Upon request of the Dean of Research, template contracts have been drawn up by the legal departments of WUR for scholarship PhD candidates, externally funded / external PhD candidates, and for situations in which a company sponsors a substantial part of the (salary) costs of the PhD. The template contracts are available via the legal department of AFSG.

Required steps:

- Contact [AFSG Contractmanagement](#) to start up the contract procedure.
- Inform [AFSG aquisitiecontrol](#) on the funding of the project.
- Once the contract is finalised, the final version needs to be uploaded in Hora Finita by the promotor.

Daan will receive financial support, resources and other forms of support for the next four years so that he will be able to establish himself as a leader in the field. Extra impulse for research and cooperating on preventive health

Five research projects - 28 researchers of the alliance between Eindhoven University of Technology, Wageningen University & Research, Utrecht University and Utrecht University Medical Center (EWUU) will receive 200 thousand euros to accelerate research and cooperation in the field of preventive health. The research is aimed at preventing disease and optimizing quality of life. The collaboration between the four different institutions will bring together the knowledge of different research areas to provide effective preventive measures. BioSB Course; Constraint-based modelling: Introduction and advanced topics (13-17 February '23)

[This course](#) will introduce computational modeling of large (genome-scale) metabolic reaction networks through a scalable framework known as constraint-based modeling. Emphasis will be on the usage in both biotechnology and systems biomedicine.

Online course: Introduction to Open Science – Concepts, benefits, and practices (20-24 February '23).

A key goal of science is to help society solve today's wicked challenges. This requires reliable, trustworthy, and high-quality research. Open Science (OS) strongly contributes to achieving these requirements since it aims to make research more verifiable, transparent, and reusable. However, OS is currently not the norm in academia due to cultural and technical obstacles. [This course](#) aims to overcome these obstacles through a conceptual and a practical overview of OS principles.

BioSB Course; Knowledge graph in the life sciences (13-17 March '23)

The term "FAIR Linked Data" refers to a set of best practices for publishing, interlinking and managing structured data on the Web. The first part of [the course](#) introduces the knowledge, theory, and skills needed to work with Linked Data and then focuses on research and industrial data applications and needs that are increasingly in demand.

10th International Granulation Conference (21-23 June '23)

The 10th [International Granulation Conference](#) will be the place to showcase the latest in agglomeration, granulation and particle technology.

BioSB Course; Algorithms for Biomolecular Networks (Advanced) (26-30 June '23)

In [this course](#), we will first give a brief overview of molecular biology, the advent of high-throughput measurement techniques and large databases containing biological knowledge, and the importance of networks to model all this.

Calls and grants

L'Oréal-Unesco for 2023 Women in Science Fellowships

The [call for applications](#) for the 2023 L'Oréal-Unesco for Women in Science (FWiS) fellowships opens on 16 January '23. In line with the international FWiS-programme, the call for applications for the Dutch fellowships is this year extended to include women researchers from both the Life Sciences and the STEM disciplines. Two fellowships, grants of €30.000 each, will be awarded with the intention to advance the academic career of women researchers three to six years after they have finished a PhD.

Neys-van Hoogstraten FUND – Funding available for socioeconomic research on food security in Asia

MSc students, PhD candidates or postdocs can now apply for funding for socioeconomic research on food security in Asia through the newly established [Neys-van Hoogstraten Fund](#), a fund under the umbrella of the University Fund Wageningen. The focus of the research must be on food security of households or nutritional security of vulnerable groups in the one or more of the countries in Southeast and South Asia that the fund supports.

Call AI for preventive health and a circular society

[This call](#), deadline 15 February '23, is organised by the following three working groups of the Alliance TU/e – WUR – UU – UMC Utrecht: institute 4 Preventive Health, Circular Society and Artificial Intelligence for Health, to stimulate ideas for research projects from within the Alliance TU/e, WUR, UU and UMCU that will contribute to the innovative development and application of trustworthy AI. Proposals should focus on the innovative use of AI-methods and tap into at least one of the themes/research lines of the institute 4 Preventive Health or Circular Society.
