# Poster Presentation Guidelines; abstract submission, poster presentations

Participants are not obliged to present a poster but it is strongly recommended because it facilitates contact between people working in the same field of research. The poster does not necessarily have to contain results. For participants that have just started their research an introduction to their work is sufficient. Participants that want to present a poster are obliged to submit a poster abstract.

## **Rules for abstract submission**

- Abstracts should be submitted as a **Word** document.
- Include your titles, full name, initials, affiliation(s) and contact details in the heading.
- Abstracts must not exceed 300 words below the heading. Include any Reference or Acknowledgement in the word count.
- **Do not** include Tables or Figures and do not use indenting.

## **Rules for poster submission**

#### Poster as PdF

We would like to receive your poster digital (PDF file) before the start of the course. These will be uploaded in the course information on MS Teams. *Please send in your poster as PDF file before Monday May 29, 2023* 

### Printed poster for the poster sessions

You need to bring your poster to the venue. The recommended size of the poster is A0 and the maximum size should not exceed 1.2m height x 1.0m width. There are no demands regarding layout or design.

#### **Poster sessions**

There are two scheduled poster sessions in the programme. Your poster will be assigned to one of these sessions. During this session you will present your poster by standing next to it, explaining your research findings and defending your research by inviting visitors to ask questions and to discuss your research.

#### Poster prize

All

participants and lecturers will be asked to select their three favorite posters. From these ratings the over-all best three will receive a poster prize. The first prize winner will be asked to give a 10-15 minutes presentation.

The poster presentation will be rewarded with 0.5 ECTS credit points.
