Lunch lecture: The road to the Spinoza Prize, John Van der Oost



Prof. dr. J. (John) Van der Oost:

Professor of Microbiology, is internationally regarded as one of the founders of the pioneering CRISPR-Cas9 technique. CRISPR-Cas9 is a molecular system that enables scientists to cut DNA with high precision allowing the modification of genes. He was awarded a Spinoza Prize in 2018 for his outstanding, ground-breaking and continuous work on CRISPR-Cas9.

Spinoza Prize.

The Spinoza Prize is the highest award in Dutch science given by The Netherlands Organisation for Scientific Research (NWO). The Prize is given to researchers working in the Netherlands as a mark of honour and stimulus for further research.
